Abstract

This session assumes no prior knowledge of quantitative data analysis or statistics and is designed to give an overview of what statistics can do and the underlying principles behind statistical analysis. It is not designed to teach people how to do statistics, but will enable general understanding of statistical methods, and should be particularly useful in making sense of the results section of quantitative research papers. It does not require any mathematical background and is suitable for attendees from all disciplines.
